Secondary Progress Reporting

All classroom teachers will provide and review a course syllabus with each class. The course syllabus is to include: units, curriculum aligned activities and grading practices.

Formative Assessments

of a students grade

Formative assessments are to be embedded in daily instruction and may include:

- homework
- classwork
- group work
- exploratory labs
- exit tickets
- draft essays

Summative Assessments



of a students grade

Summative assessments occur after instruction has taken place on topic, standard or unit.

Examples of summative assessments are:

- unit tests
- announced quizzes
- major projects
- essays
- tests
- labs
- final exams
- * Teachers are to assign a minimum grade of 50% to assignments or assessments for which the student made an effort.
- ** All grade reporting must be conducted through PowerSchool to maintain clear communication to students and parents.

Make-Up Work

Students are expected to make up work per the county attendance policy.

Retesting

Students who demonstrated effort and have not met expectations may have the opportunity to retake a summative assessment with the following stipulations:

- it must be during the marking period after the due date and before the NEXT summative assessment.
- retesting will be done at a <u>time mutually agreed upon</u> by the student and the teacher.
- the student can earn a maximum of 80% on the retake, the highest of the two scores will go on record.
- retests will <u>not</u> be given for final/end-of-year exams.



If a student receives a grade below 60% in a state assessed course (Government, Algebra I, and ELA 10) but receives a passing score on the state assessment the student is then eligible to earn a 60% in the related course.
